FROM THE CANTOR

I was shopping at the local supermarket the other day and picked up a copy of the complimentary Passover Haggadah. This year's

version is brand new and clearly in a more contemporary style. For starters, many of the important parts of the Haggadah are now offered in transliteration. There is also a feature called "The Steps of the Seder" which outlines the order of the evening and tells you, on each page, precisely where you are in the scheme of things. The typography is also crisper and cleaner looking.

But wait! Some things are missing! Where are the pictures of the 4 children that usually accompany the text? I like to study the artist's depiction of the wise, wicked, simple, and the one who doesn't know how to ask. And where are the pictures of the pious rabbis sitting around discussing the story of the exodus late into the night. Even the crossing of the sea is no longer depicted! Instead, all we have are simple graphics of wine cups, grapes, leaves, matzhahs and the like. And at the end of the Haggadah, the editors apparently opted for spatial efficiency by eliminating all the repetition in the verses of Echod Mi Yodea and Chad Gadyah. I suppose they needed to make room for their centerfold, which contains...coupons! Yes, you open this booklet, a central work of Jewish liturgy, and you get coupons! Now, it should not really distract us from the recitation of the Haggadah because presumably the coupons would have been removed and used well before the Seder night. But then, they'd be used only if you were a fan of chocolate covered jelly rings, marshmallows and a particular brand of sardines or gefilte fish. But I don't mean to complain. The centerfold with the coupons and advertisements can readily be removed without much trouble at all, and anyway, who doesn't appreciate a good deal on macaroons? And let's not forget that the fine folks at the supermarket are offering the Haggadahs as a complimentary gift to their Jewish customers, so a

good measure of gratitude is in order.

Nevertheless, from a traditionalist perspective, I was at first mildly disappointed with the changes in this Haggadah. But spending a little time with this new version, it has definitely grown on me, and I appreciate that its user-friendliness may well appeal to the modern, contemporary sedergoer. Anyway, at the end of the day, or night, it's not so much what the Haggadah brings to the seder table that matters, but what we bring—our curiosity and our questions, our ideas and our interpretations, our spirit and our joy. It is a night to celebrate freedom-- to contemplate what exactly freedom means, and the ways to fully appreciate it. It's a night to be with family and friends, and of course, to enjoy a delicious holiday meal.

I wish everyone a Chag Kasher v'Sameach. May this be a joyous Passover for you and our brothers and sisters everywhere!

Since moving onto the kibbutz, the general pace and schedule of my life has changed drastically. There's such a relaxed family atmosphere here. Twice a week we barbeque dinner together and our afternoons are spent playing games and reading outside on the grassy fields. It's like nothing else I've ever experienced. A lot of exciting things have been happening lately. Early in March, all of Nativ came back together in Jerusalem for a leadership conference run by Masa. We met kids on other gap year programs, as well as grad students spending time in Israel. Altogether there were about 400 people in attendance. We were divided into groups based on where we will be going to college, so I had the chance to meet other gap year students going to UMD in the fall. We went to seminars on topics such as "Community Innovation" and "Campus

Entrepreneurship". We also had programs such as a lecture at Yad Vashem, a trip to the Givat Ram campus of Hebrew University for a social justice workshop with a wheelchair basketball team, and "Open Spaces" with ROI where we got to choose our own discussion topics including naptime, aliyah, and intermarriage and dinosaurs. As if this weren't already enough, a group of eight Nativers and two madrichim came together to record a Kabbalat Shabbat CD for USCJ. We spent about two days practicing and then 13 hours over a two day period in a Jerusalem recording studio. It was an awesome experience. Not only were the melodies we were singing beautiful, the time we spent together as a group was a lot of fun. There was a lot of joking going on to offset the stress of recording. Stay tuned for our CD! After a packed week, we returned to the kibbutz and went back to work. Work in the refet is never dull. There are many cows to be herded and milked, and plenty of new ones on the way. Just a few days ago my fellow refet workers and I got to assist in the birth of a calf. It was so amazing. If anyone is interested in seeing it, there's a video on the Nativmaster youtube channel. However, be warned, it is not for the squeamish. There you can also check out videos of what else is going on with Nativ. Purim is this Saturday night. All of Nativ is meeting up together in Jerusalem for the occasion. I can't wait to see everyone's costumes!
