Excerpt from Cantor Stern's L'Chaim Award Greetings

One of the great texts of Jewish Tradition is called Pirkei Avot – and it contains many of the ethical teachings of our Sages. And at the very beginning it declares that there are three pillars upon which this world stands, and they are: Torah, which is to say, the teachings of law and ethical values; Avodah, which represents worship of the heart; and Gemilat Chasadim, the performance of daily acts of loving kindness.
